Here is a great <u>list of children's books</u> to address a variety of Social and Emotional topics. Consider putting some of these books on hold at the new Castle Rock branch of the <u>Douglas</u> <u>County Libraries</u>. Keep kids reading and increasing their SEL skills over the upcoming break!

Have you ever felt the "winter blues?" Colder temperatures and bad weather can make socializing more difficult. While holiday celebrations are often fun, they can also cause a lot of increased stress. The isolation paired with stress and shorter amounts of daylight are a perfect recipe for Seasonal Affective Disorder, appropriately abbreviated to SAD. If you or your children experience an increase in irritability, a decrease in energy levels, interrupted sleep patterns, and a general feeling of sadness during winter months, you are definitely not alone. 



The kids got to experience several birds of prey up close.








INNOVATIONS and INVENTIONS




SPECIALS SPOTLIGHT



These December celebrations showcase diverse traditions, each holding unique cultural, religious, or symbolic significance, bringing people together in joyous remembrance and anticipation for the future.






BOOK REVIEW

Word count: 56,872




EDUCATIONAL GAMES




